1 Fire crackers. Used at midnight on New Year to drive away bad luck.
- 


2 Small red Chinese drum toy. In festivals large drums are used.
- 


3 Miniature lion. A model of the kind used in the lion dance.
- 


4 Paper lantern used at New Year and at the Lantern Festival.
- 


5 Chinese palace lantern.
- 


6 5 paper lanterns that fold flat.
- 


7 Chinese Phoenix lantern.
- 


8 4 New Year greetings cards given to friends & family or by businesses for advertising.
- 


9 Red money envelopes. Children receive these full of money from adult relatives.
- 


10 Two small laminated posters with Chinese writing on. Would be hung outside the gate.
- 

11 2 New Year posters. One with dragon is from the Year of the Dragon.
- 

12 A long poster which translates as "Be kind and things will do well". Would be displayed as a pair on a gate outside.
- 

13 2 wall hangings made of red and gold plastic. Square one relates to Year of the Horse or Dragon.
- 

14 Square poster would be hung on wall or door, means good luck.
- 

15 3 Papercut decorations

16 Astrological chart. 2008 - Year of the Rat.
