6  Sweeping brush made from dried grasses.


7  Fly whisk made from the tail of a wildebeest.

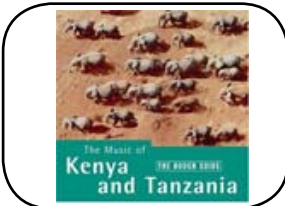

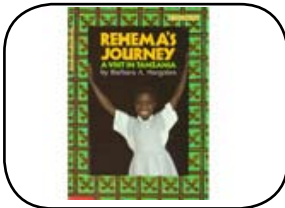

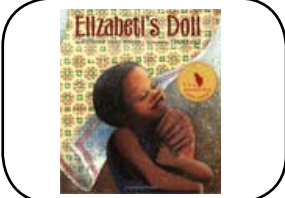

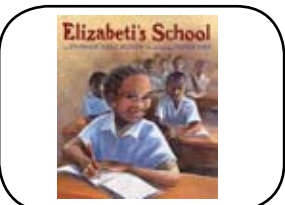

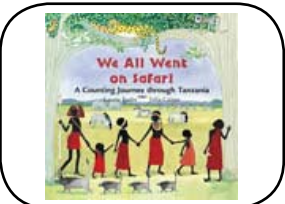

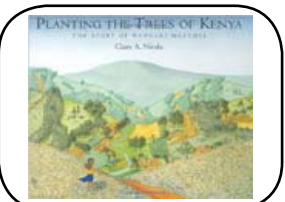
