The Global Collections bring countries to life by giving children the chance to handle real objects, see images and film clips, and engage in meaningful activities to challenge their perceptions about different cultures.























In addition there is a British bag with objects representing British culture. The aim of this is to get across how difficult it is to represent a whole country with just a few objects.

To think critically about how the objects represent Britain and how they relate to our persons views of Britain.

Bring in the red British Bag. Tell children that this is a collection of objects that some people think represent British. What do the children think about these objects? Are there any that they don't agree with and would take out? Why? How are they different to the objects that the class relocated?

Is this what it means to be British? Is there anything missing? Maybe they are things that are harder to put in a sufcase the feelings or ansits or behaviour – for example queueing or taking about the weather. How might you represent these?


