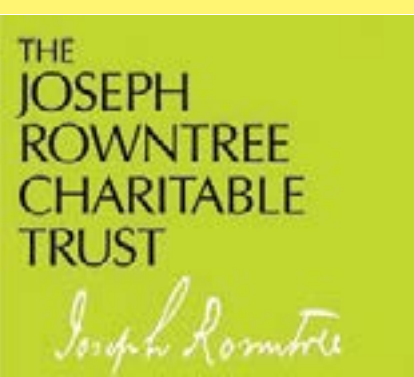
- Drop-down themed days
