## Session One: Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> July 2021 6.00-9.00 p.m. Gender equality in education

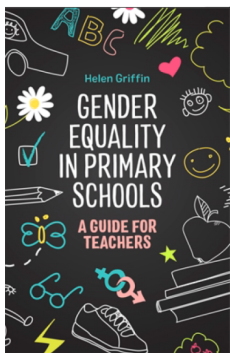

This session introduces [Gender Action](#) (the UK version of the GECM) which is an award programme which promotes and supports a whole-school approach to challenging stereotypes. (Including: Personal practice Student voice - Curriculum and learning Internal and external communications and Engagement with parents, carers and the wider school community.)
